This is an open call for the youth in Jordan (aged 18-30) to participate in the Global Knowledge Index (GKI) 3-Day Workshop tackling the results of Jordan in the GKI 2018. Participants have an opportunity to win a valuable prize – details of the prize will be announced during the workshop.

In line with the continuous effort to promote the Global Knowledge Index (GKI) as an advocacy tool and to widely disseminate and embed it in policy debates, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation (MBRF), under the umbrella of the Knowledge Project, and in partnership with the Ministry of Youth in Jordan and Abdul Hameed Shoman Foundation, are launching a GKI Workshop in Jordan. We are calling the youth in Jordan to weigh the results of their country in the Global Knowledge Index, in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and come up with policy recommendations on how to enhance their living conditions.

AREAS TO BE ADDRESSED

The Global Knowledge Index 2018 ranks Jordan 76th out of 134 countries with a score below the world average. The workshop aims at joining Jordanian youth to design a detailed action plan to solve the intractable challenges preventing the Jordanian society from being a knowledge society. Participants are expected to perform analytical and logical reasoning to generate practical recommendations, which will be presented to decision makers to reinforce the efforts towards building a knowledge-based society. The performance of Jordan on the Global Knowledge Index 2018 will be the starting point.

Sectors of the Global Knowledge Index to be covered:

- ☞ Pre-university education
- ☞ Research, development and innovation (RDI)
- ☞ Technical and vocational education and training (TVET)
- ☞ Information and communications technology (ICT)
- ☞ Higher education
- ☞ Economy

- ✦ Participants are requested to select one or two sectors to work on.
- ✦ Participants will work on the analysis during the first two days of the workshop and will present their findings/recommendations during the last day to decision-makers.

BACKGROUND

Objectives of the Global Knowledge Index Workshop

The workshop comes as a part of a series of workshops and seminars to promote the Global Knowledge Index (GKI) as an advocacy tool and to widely disseminate and imbed it in policy debates. The workshops and seminars aim to drive active conversation, raise awareness, and inform stakeholders and audiences about the key features and anticipated outcomes of the Global Knowledge Index and the relation between knowledge and development.

About the Global Knowledge Index

The only index that measures knowledge on the global level.

The Index aims to measure the multidimensional concept of knowledge. The concept is a fluid one, often linked to related concepts such as 'knowledge economy' or 'knowledge society'. It is also sometimes restricted to a narrow understanding that limits the focus to education or technology.

Given the variations in its use and meaning, the GKI aims to introduce a more systematic understanding of knowledge in two respects:

→ It breaks down the concept into its constituent components - i.e. pre-university education, technical and vocational education and training (TVET), higher education, research, development and innovation (RDI), information and communications technology (ICT), and economy, in addition to the general enabling environment. Therefore, it recognizes the multidimensional nature of knowledge systems in all contexts and applications relating to economic and social structures. This allows a more meaningful and insightful exploration of knowledge policies in relation to different sectors.

→ It also enables a more scientific and evidence-based linkage between development and a multidimensional concept of knowledge, in keeping with the notion of human development as applied by UNDP as well as the concept of sustainable development agreed by world leaders in 2015 in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

About the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development is a set of 17 aspirational and global goals with 169 targets. This Agenda is a plan of action for people, planet and prosperity. It also seeks to strengthen universal peace in larger freedom.

"Leave no one behind" is the foundational principle of the United Nations' Agenda 2030, which, with its Sustainable Development Goals, targets, and implementation plans, form the most comprehensive blueprint for eliminating extreme poverty, reducing inequality and protecting the planet.



About the Knowledge Project

The Knowledge Project aims to promote knowledge societies and policies as transformational means to achieve sustainable development. The project contributes to driving active conversation and raise awareness on the importance of knowledge and knowledge-based policies for sustainable development.

The project encourages using the knowledge products, namely the Global Knowledge Index, as advocacy tools, aiming to widely disseminate and embed in policy debates.

The partnership between the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation (MBRF) goes back to 2008, with the establishment of the Knowledge Project.

Under the umbrella of this partnership, the Knowledge Project has published three regional reports about knowledge in the Arab region, two of which involved original field research and country case studies, the Arab Knowledge Index 2015 and 2016, and the Arab Reading Index 2016. Then came the Global Knowledge Index in 2017, which is the only index that measures knowledge on the global level as a broad concept that is intricately related to sustainable development. In 2018, the second edition of the Global Knowledge Index was released, in addition to an analytical report on the GKI 2017 results under the title “Knowledge and the Fourth Industrial Revolution” and a foresight report on the “Future of Knowledge.”

The Knowledge4All portal was launched in 2015 as a digital platform for knowledge, followed by a mobile app in 2016.

UNDP and MBRF had built a remarkable partnership throughout the past decade, sharing a vision of promoting and strengthening knowledge-based sustainable development in the Arab States and beyond.
